If Mental Illnesses Were Monsters, This Is What They'd Look Like

"I want to make people aware of how damaging these illnesses are."

Mental illness is an intangible thing that can be all but impenetrable to those who don't experience it.

That's why the U.K.-based artist [Toby Allen](#) decided to draw different mental illnesses as monsters, as a way of helping himself and ultimately others.

"The project originated from imagining my own anxieties as monsters and finding it to be a cathartic and healing process to draw them," Allen told The Huffington Post in an email. "It made them feel weaker and I was able to look at my own anxiety in a comical way. I wanted to expand upon this idea and draw other representations of mental illnesses that could help people in the same way it helped me."

Allen's "[Real Monsters](#)" series is a collection of illustrations that anthropomorphize mental illnesses like depression, schizophrenia and body dysmorphic disorder.

"I hoped to draw attention to mental illnesses that often get ignored or aren't taken seriously," he said. "I want to make people aware of how damaging these illnesses are and how much of a burden they can be to those who suffer from them. The project also highlights conditions that some people may have never even heard of, so the work aims to raise awareness for these. I hope that people can relate to the work and that it helps them to see their illness in a different light, make it appear more manageable."

Allen said the response to his work has been hugely positive thanks to its presence on [Tumblr](#). He first started sharing the images in 2013.

"I have received so many wonderful messages from people who live with one or many of the disorders I have drawn," he said, "each telling me how much the work means to them and how it has helped them to think about their condition in a different or more positive way."

In another article from Fast Company, written in 2013, Allen describes the thinking behind his Anxiety monster. "The Anxiety monster, for example, was inspired by the secretive and furtive habits of rodents. The dark colors represent the oppressive feelings that Allen associates with feeling anxious, and the bright pink tail symbolizes an anxiety-related panic attack. He included a clock to demonstrate how anxious he often feels about future events."

The article goes on to tell about what goes into making his monsters. "In his new watercolor collection, Real

Monsters, Allen gives form to the serious illness including Borderline Personality Disorder, Schizophrenia, and Depression. He researches each condition and adds to the drawing as his understanding of the particular disorder comes into focus.

Anxiety

The anxiety monster is small enough to sit on its victims shoulder and whisper things into their unconscious eliciting fearful thoughts and irrational worries. The anxiety monster is often seen as weak in comparison to others, but it is one of the most common and very hard to get rid of.

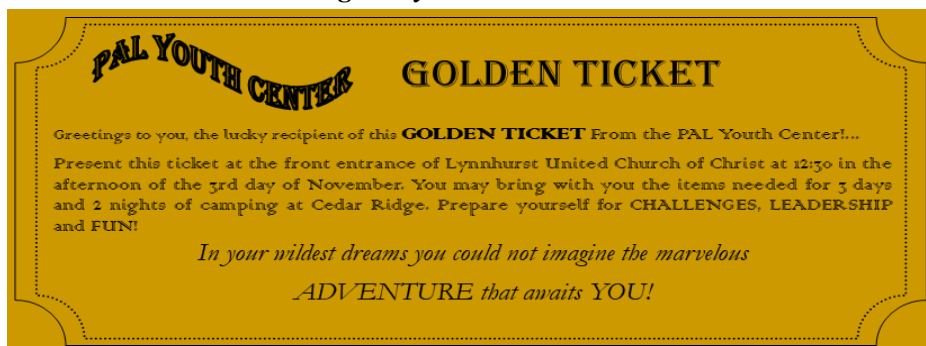
They often carry small objects often linked to their victim's anxieties such as clocks which represent a common but irrational fear of things that might never happen. No-one has ever seen the face of the anxiety monster for it always wears a skull as a mask.

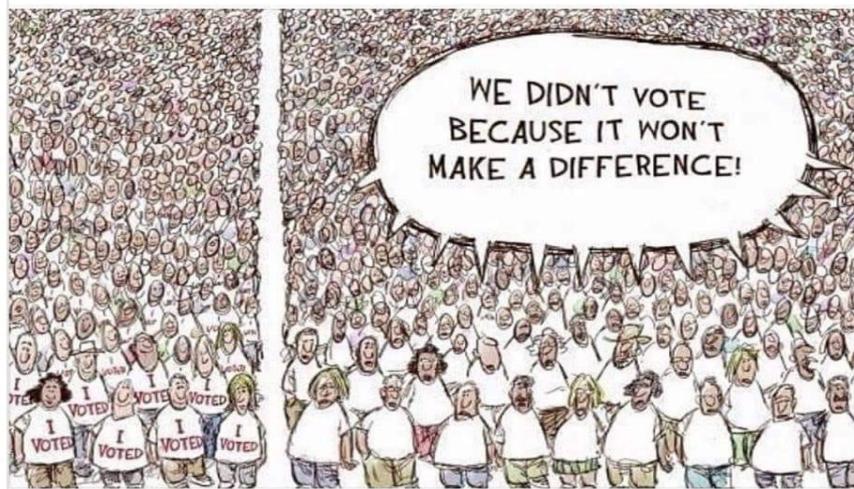

- **Front Desk Support - Fridays, Anytime from 8:30-4:00 at 415 1/2 Ashland Ave** - We like to call this position the "Welcome Manager" You're the first person someone talks to and sees when they need assistance so we're looking for someone compassionate and patient. You will never be bored and you'll get to know a lot of neighbors! We do ask that you're comfortable with the computer and on the phone communicating clearly with people who are in crisis.
